## Just one little letter can change a doctrine ...

The "Bible" you read **matters**. The <u>King James Bible</u> was translated word-for-word. Other bibles are re-written thought-for-thought. <u>Things That Are Different Are Not the Same!</u> Don't be fooled. Even some King James "version" publishers are making changes on the inside. How can we know which ones have been tampered with?

Only one little letter added or deleted can change the whole meaning of a verse. Here's just one example:

## King James Bible (KJB) - 2Timothy 3:17 -

"That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works."

Notice the word "throughly" – NOT "thoroughly". Most modern bibles change the word "throughly" to "thoroughly". The word "thoroughly" has one letter **ADDED** to it. What's the difference? **A doctrine!** 

"Throughly" means that the man of God may find help *all the way through the Bible*. Man is furnished with help all the way through the Book ... the emphasis is on the Word of God itself.

"Thoroughly" means "completely", putting the emphasis on the man being completely furnished instead of *God's Word* furnishing the help. One letter changes the entire meaning of the verse! This is just one of tens of thousands of changes to the modern Bibles ... with many verses being changed to remove the very deity of Christ! It's a deception by satan, the father of lies, who wants to steal, kill and destroy! God is not the author of confusion. There is one Bible. Whether you believe it or not littless make a difference the Bible that you read and study. It's interesting to note that even other versions disagree between themselves to the sound like God to you?

Do a quick check a uoes your "Bible", in 2Tim.3:17, say "throughly"?
